## 2011 Accomplishments

1,778 individuals were served in Resettlement
In October, we began a regional Anti-Trafficking
initiative. Through this program, we help foreignborn survivors of sex and labor trafficking across
Minnesota and Northern Wisconsin—as well as
create outreach programs to educate the public on
signs of trafficking.

500 students were served in Education Programs
The Medical Careers Pathway employed 120 New
Americans in living wage jobs in the healthcare
field: 109 Nursing Assistant students found jobs
and 11 New Americans advanced to become nurses
or other medical professionals.

## 50,000 visitors attended the Festival of Nations

In partnership with the Minnesota Planetarium Society, the Festival of Nations brought the entire universe and new cultural awareness to the 2011 celebration. New refugee groups were represented at the Festival, giving them a chance to share their culture with the general public.
