What We Do

The International Institute of Minnesota provides comprehensive services to **immigrants, refugees, asylees and trafficking survivors** so they can build new lives, find work to support their families, and contribute to their new communities.

We **served 5,709 people** in 2024.

The Institute is recognized as Minnesota's leading charitable organization dedicated to helping New Americans rebuild their lives while pursuing their personal and professional goals. We do this work through four key program areas: Refugee Services, Immigration Services, Education and Workforce Development. Refugee resettlement is indefinitely paused due to presidential executive order.

Who We Serve

In 2024, our clients across all programs came from **110 countries** around the world and spoke **38 languages**.
